

#### Energy Efficiency Upgrades Can Save You Money

## Programs



#### Net Energy Metering (NEM) Donation Pilot Program

Back in January of 2020, VCE began enrolling customers who had installed solar panels prior to our launch. NEM enrollment continues throughout the year, as we bring customers in during their normal true-up months, to ensure that they get full credit for generating more than they produced. As VCE customers, you'll always get paid a higher price for excess generation than you did from PG&E.

If you're one of our solar customers who typically accrues more than \$100/year through excess generation, you might want to participate in VCE's new Donation Pilot Program.

The NEM Donation Program would allow customers to donate their accrued balances to a charity or a non-profit, thereby qualifying for a tax deduction. During this pilot period, organizations that are mission-aligned with VCE will be identified as options. Qualifying organizations will be those that provide services to our communities, such as food, lowincome housing, family services, bill payment, or counseling.

Eligible NEM customers will be able to donate their credits in late 2020. Stay tuned for updates on this exciting new program!
